- In the final program (but not yet included in this draft):
  - All sessions will have a thematic title to guide attendees toward topics of interest.
  - All symposia & blitz sessions will be assigned a Chair, who will (a) announce each paper/presenter prior to their turn speaking, (b) monitor each presenter's time, & (c) facilitate a question period at the end. The Program Planner will oversee poster setup & facilitate participation in all poster sessions.
    - Symposia presenters will each have 10 minutes to present. The Chair will provide time updates while you speak (“2 min left,” “1 min. left,” & “Please STOP”). Please plan to upload your presentation 1 week pre-conference. You will receive more instructions re. visual aid/computer setups in the next month.
    - Blitz presenters will each have 6 minutes to present. The Chair will provide time updates while you speak (5 updates, 1 each minute, with a final “TIME OVER”). You should plan to use no more than 6 “slides” & to upload them no later than 1 week pre-conference. More info on this process will be forthcoming.
    - All poster presenters should plan to attend 2 time-sessions: (1) the period prior to their poster session, for setup, and (2) the poster session itself. To facilitate active participation, poster presenters are expected to be physically present at their posters locations during the session.
